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# Background

- Workers report information about their employers to household surveys like ACS, SIPP, CPS
- Firms report information about their business activities to IRS, SSA, BLS, Census
- Census produces statistics that show distribution of workers across industries
  - Take snapshot of workers at point in time and look at industry distribution of “main jobs”
- Census also produces statistics that show distribution of employment across industries
  - Take snapshot of establishments at point in time and look at employment-weighted industry distribution
- Differences due to
  - Multiple job holders
  - Reporting by employees versus employers
    - Workers fail to report jobs
    - Informal employment not reported by an employer
    - Employers and employees describe the activities of the business differently

## Matching Rules

1. If a matching industry exists, take that W-2 job
2. Check for 5, 4, 3, 2 digit matches and take the first match found (i.e. most detailed match available)
3. If no match, then preference W-2 jobs on the following basis:
  1. Highest earnings in year
  2. If multi-unit employer has several industries, take industry with highest share of employment

# Reasons for mis-match in industry codes

## 1. Job matched correctly but industry reports differ

Might match at 2-digit sector but not 3- or 4-digit level

## 2. Job not matched correctly

ACS job from a different time during the year

This only affects the degree of mis-match. We take the best matching job we can find.

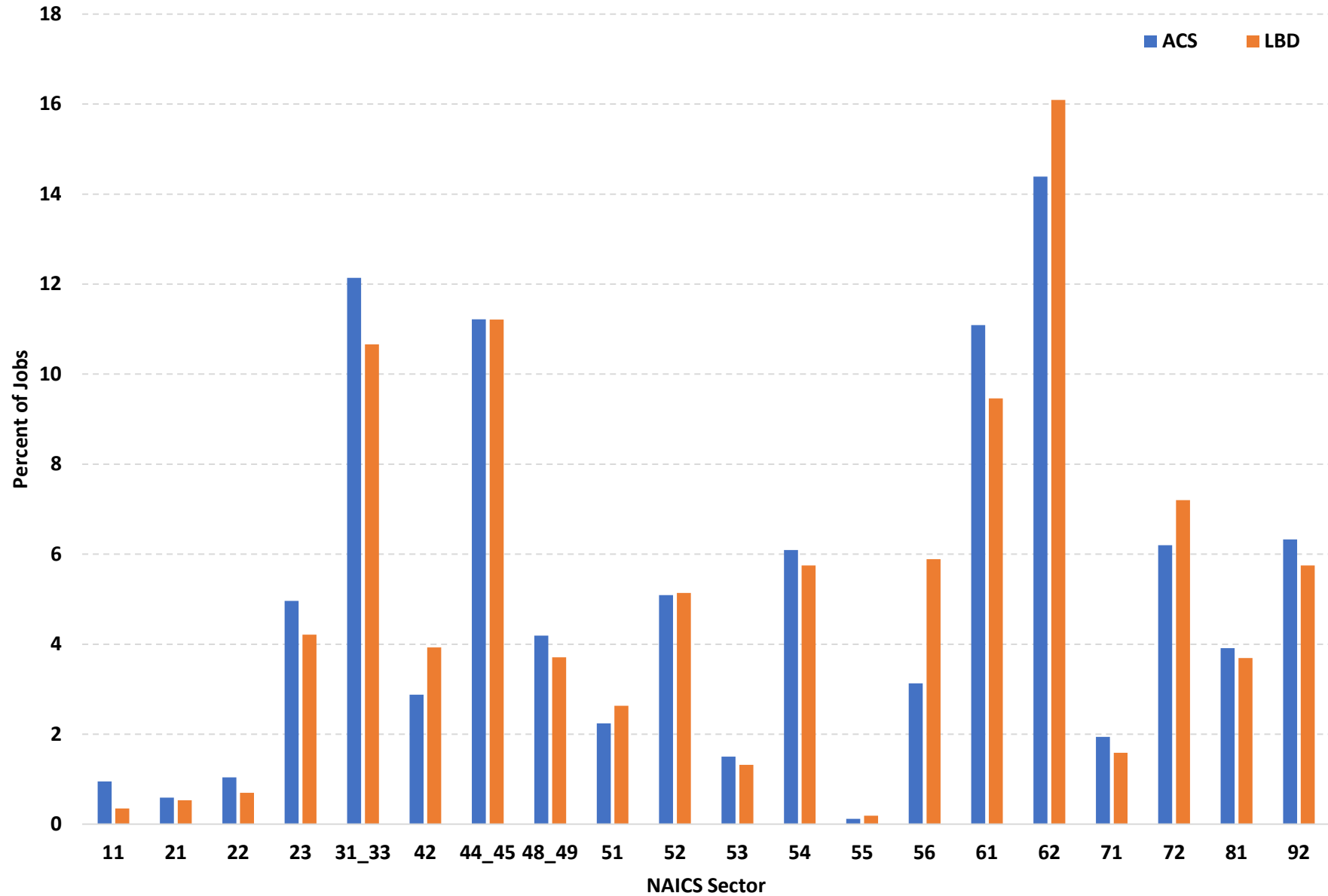
## 3. No job found in W-2

# Sample Description

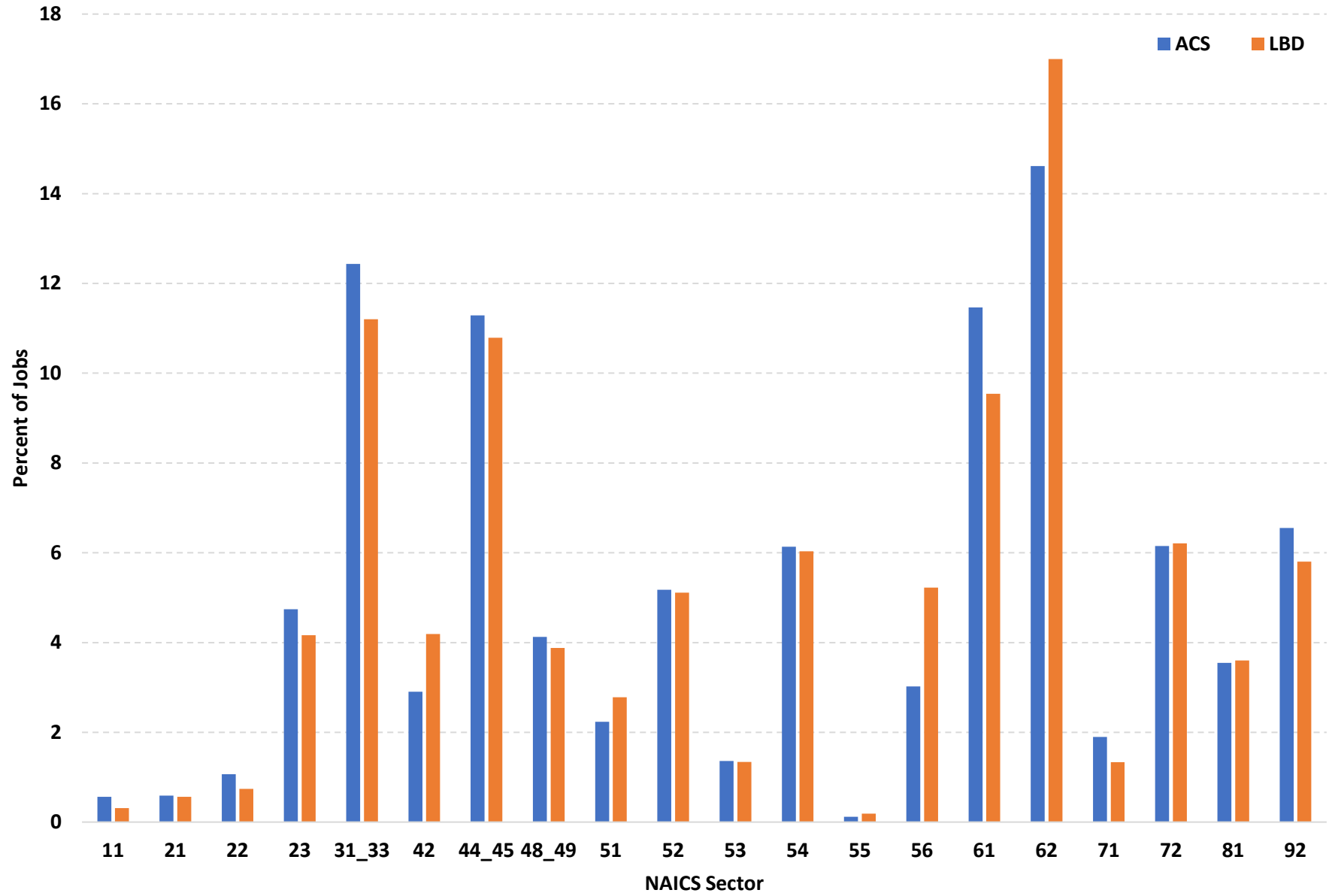
- We use ACS, W-2, and LBD data from 2005 through 2020
- Sample is limited to
  - Workers that are at least 16 years old
  - Excludes self-employed and unpaid workers
  - Excludes Puerto Rico
- All industries are put onto a NAICS 2017 vintage
- Sample sizes:
  - ACS: 29,580,000 job observations
  - LBD: 32,680,000 job observations
  - ACS-LBD overlap sample: 27,550,000 job observations



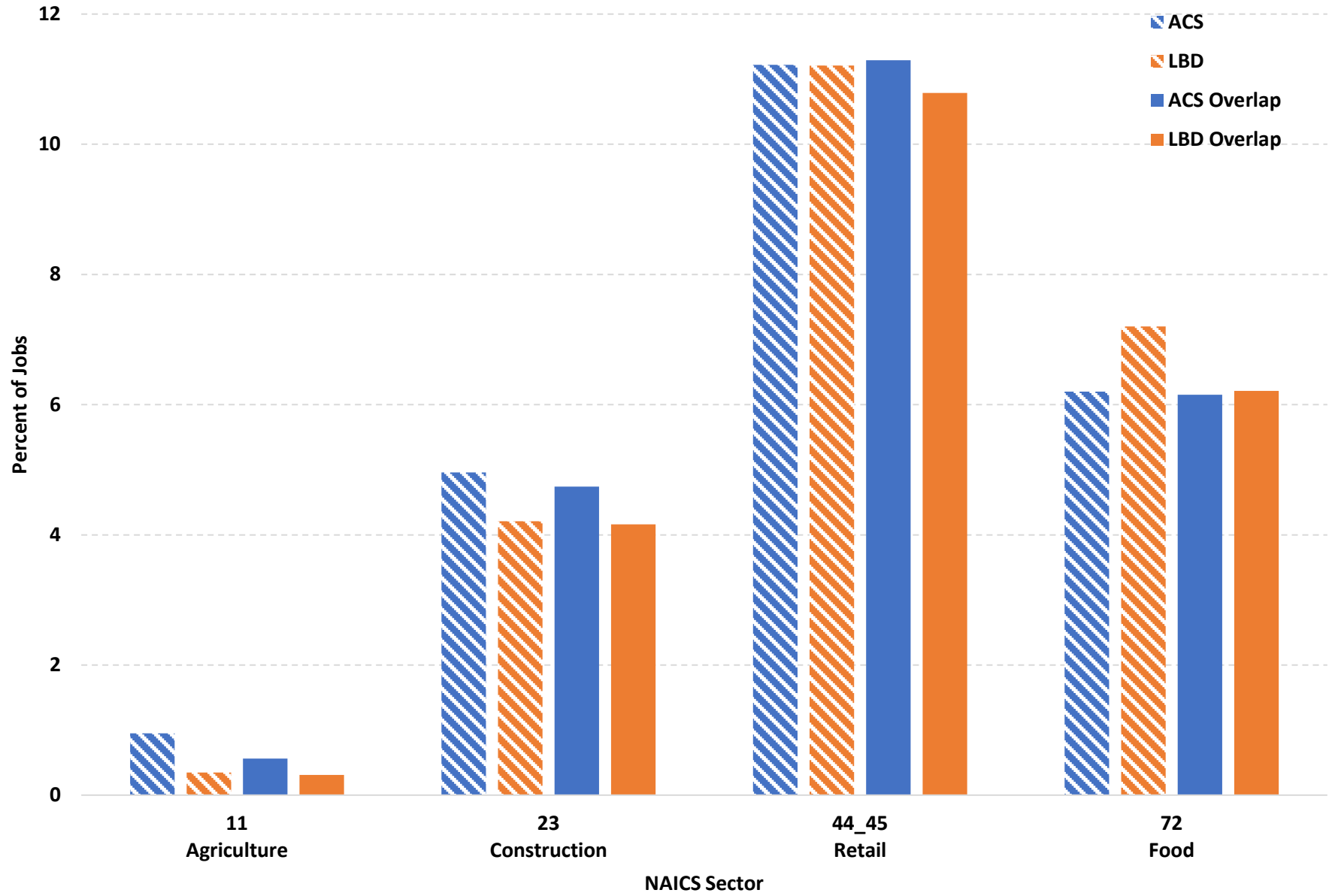
# Comparison of full ACS sample vs. full LBD sample

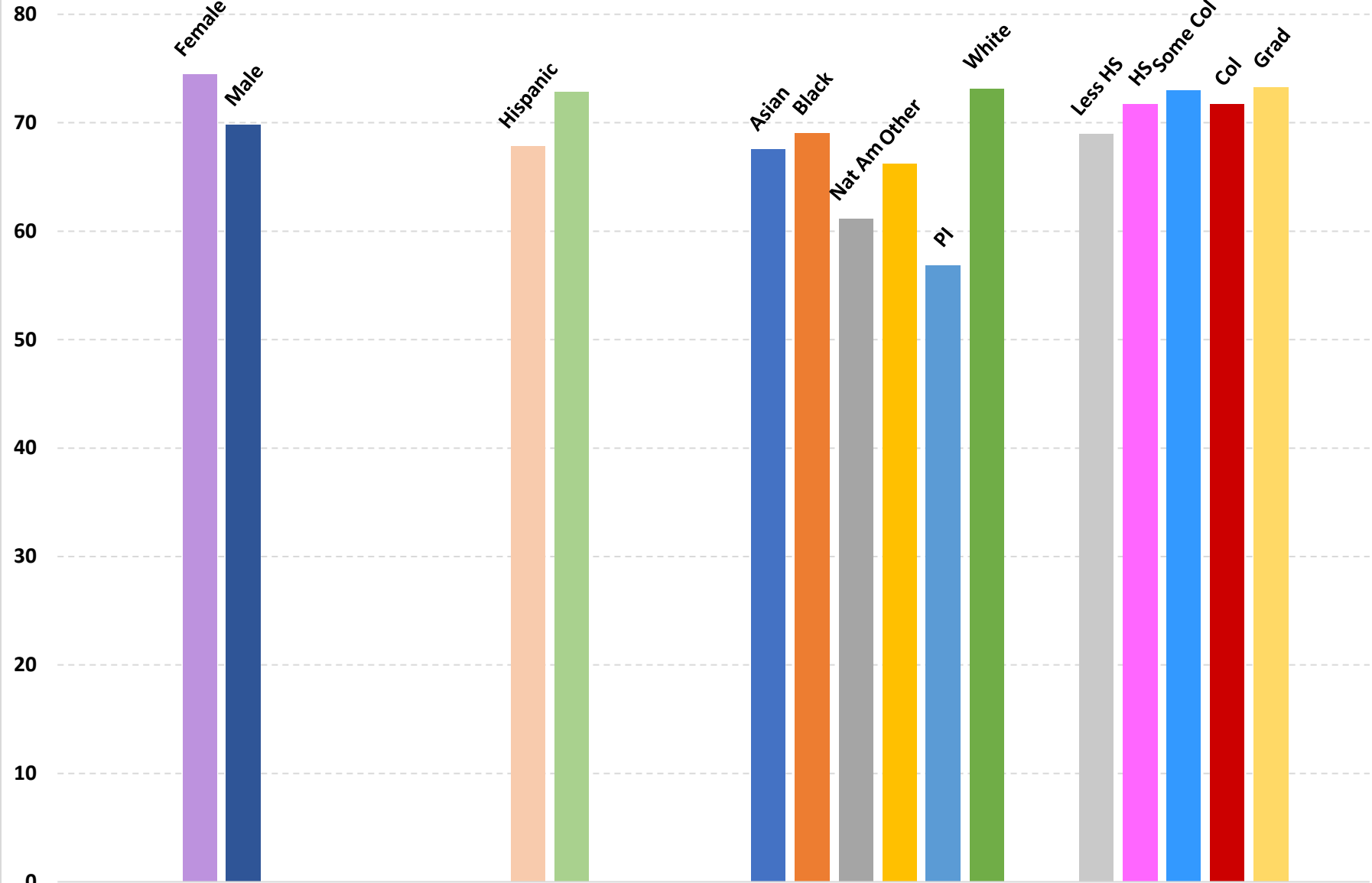
