White House Equitable Data Working Group - Overview

January 20, 2021:

President Biden issued Executive Order 13985 on Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities Through the Federal Government

Established Interagency Working Group on Equitable Data (EDWG) to:

- **Provide recommendations** and identify inadequacies in existing Federal data collection programs
- **Recommend strategies** for addressing identified deficiencies
- **Support agencies** in implementing actions that expand and refine the data available to measure equity and diversity
- **Initiate the Subcommittee on Equitable Data (SED)**

EDWG Recommendations

1

Make disaggregated data the norm while **protecting privacy**

2

Catalyze existing federal government infrastructure to **leverage underused data**

3

Build capacity for **robust equity assessment** for policymaking and program implementation

4

Galvanize diverse partnerships across levels of government and the research community

5

Be accountable to the American public
