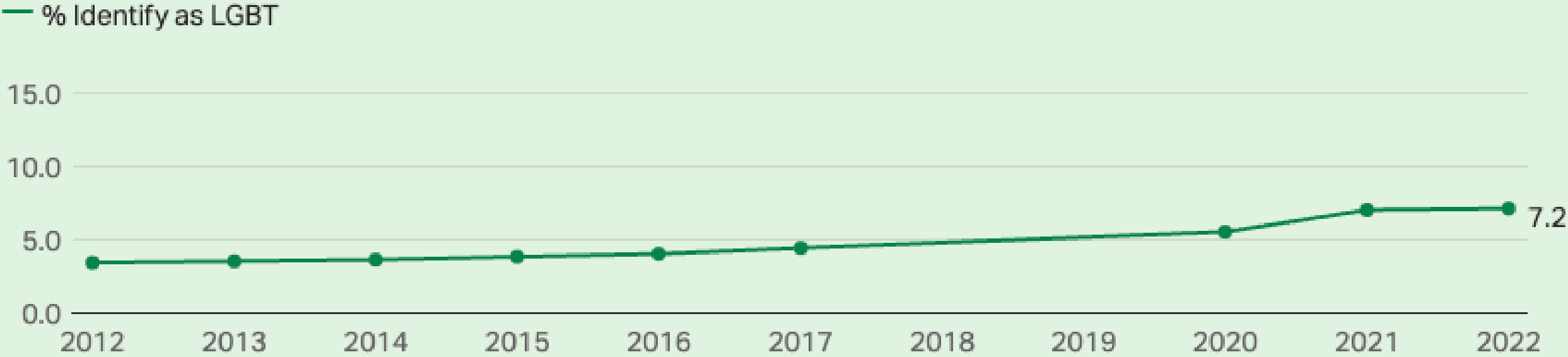

Which of the following do you consider yourself to be? You can select as many as apply. Straight or heterosexual; Lesbian; Gay; Bisexual; Transgender



Respondents who volunteer another identity (e.g., queer, same-gender-loving; pansexual) are recorded as "Other LGBT" by interviewers. These responses are included in the LGBT estimate.

Data were not collected in 2018 and 2019.

What is your sex? Note: A questions about your gender will follow if you are aged 16 or over (Female/Male)

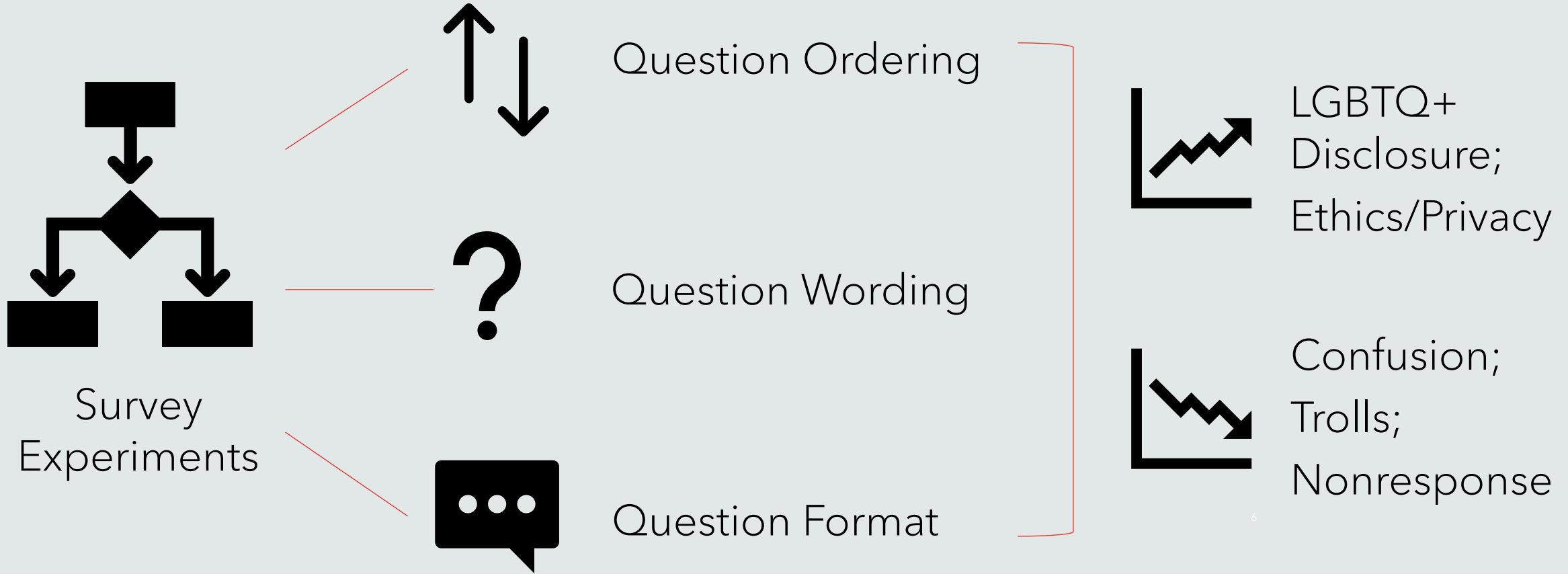
Is your gender the same as the sex you were registered at birth? Note: This question is voluntary (Yes; No, write in gender)

Measurement Debate

Pros	Cons
Great inclusivity of minority identities (representation)	Need to determine which identities are measured (still exclusive)
New data to understand emerging social realities	Data harmonization to understand longstanding inequalities
Better counts of minority populations	Potentially worse counts for majority populations
Detailed data	Privacy, undercounts

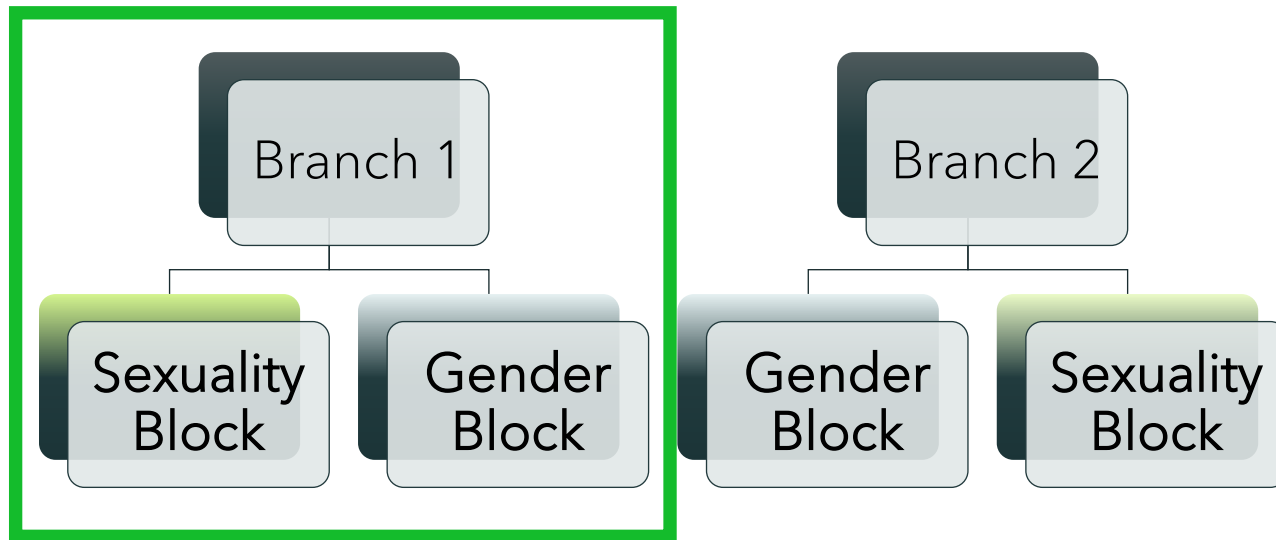

Does the block order affect disclosure and nonresponse patterns?



Data: Pilot Study

Finding 1: Sexuality before gender increased noncisgender disclosure. (~1 percentage point)

Finding 2: Ordering had no significant difference on nonresponse.

Disclosure by Block Randomization (Pilot Study)

Noncisgender Disclosure

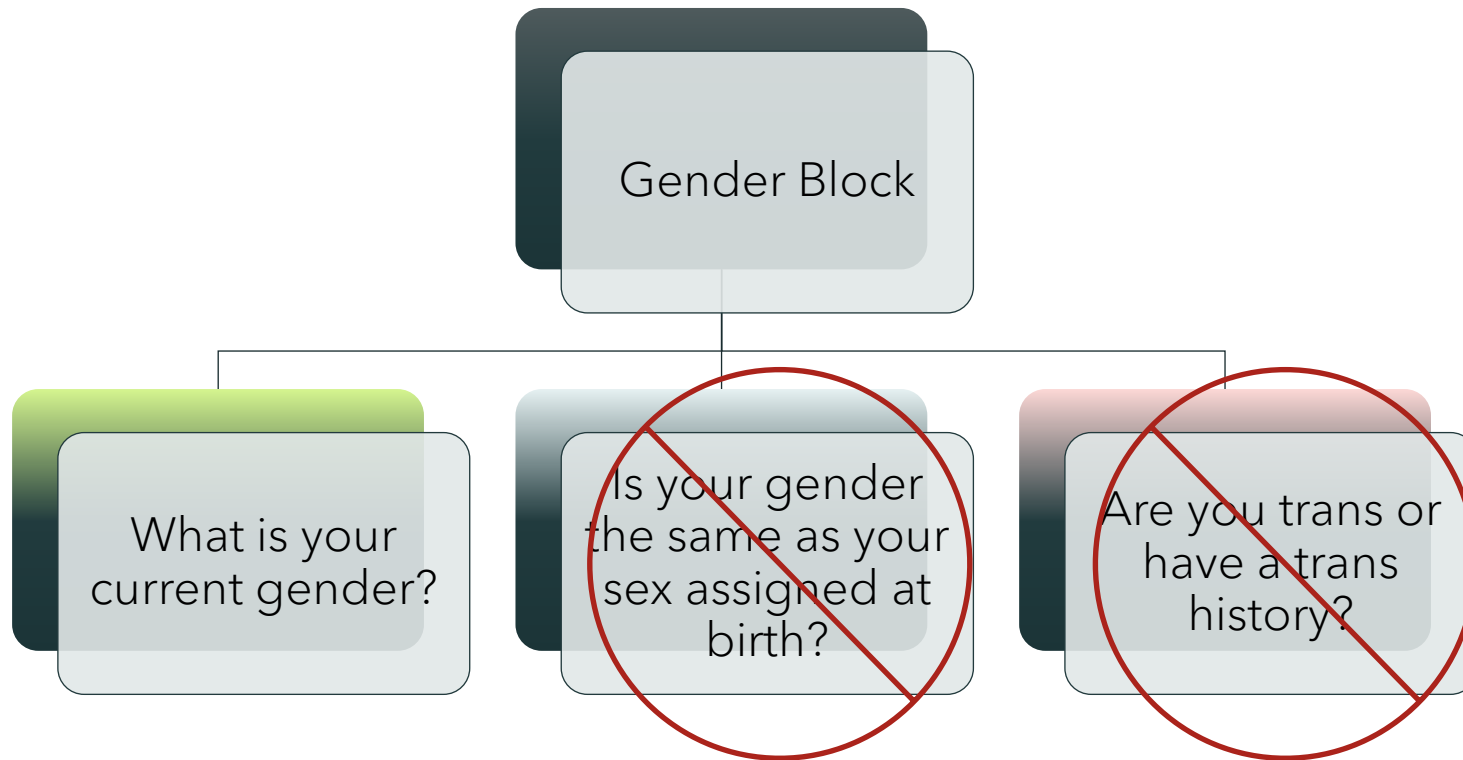

Does the wording of the two-step gender question affect disclosure and nonresponse?

Finding 3: Asking for gender in relation to sex significantly *reduced* noncisgender disclosure. (~.5 percentage points)

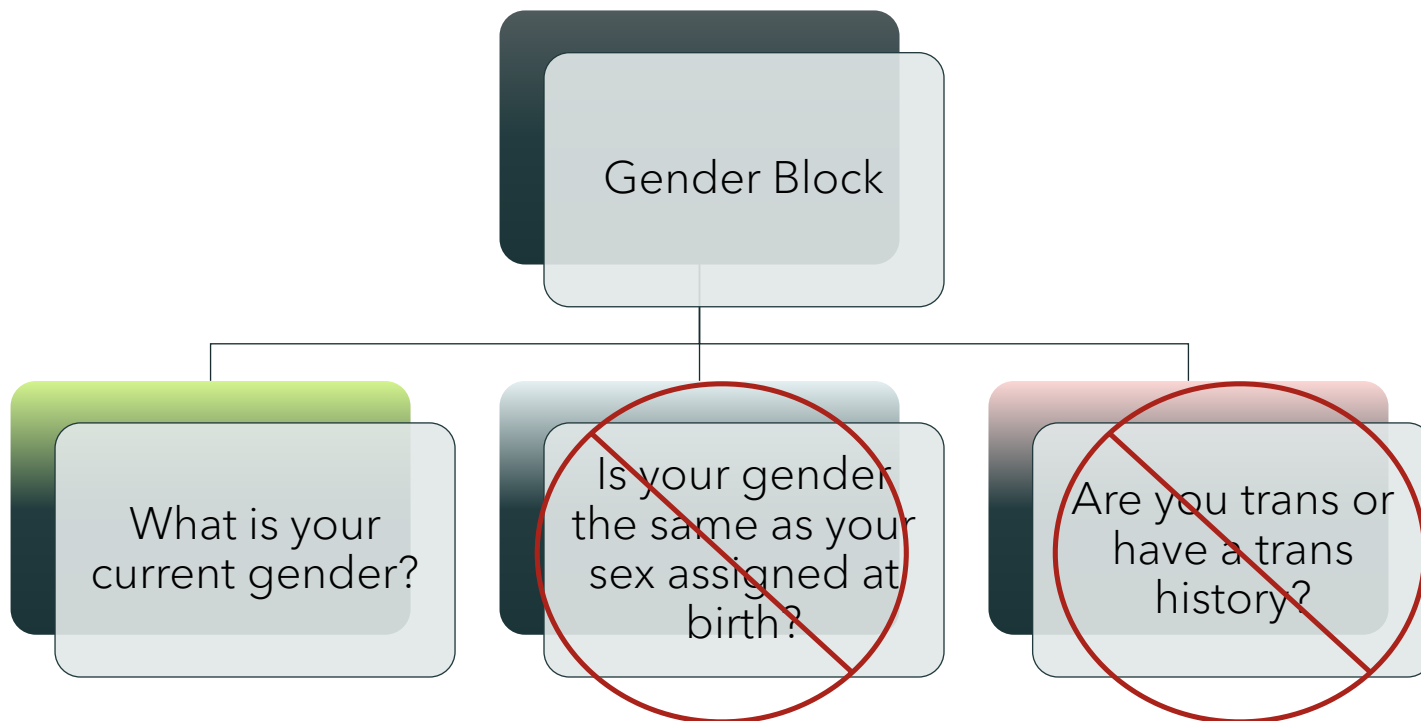
Finding 4: Asking about gender in relation to sex and trans status significantly *increased* nonresponse. (~.2 percentage points)

Disclosure by Two-Step (COVID States)

	Cisgender	Noncisgender
"What is your gender?"	6791 (0.980)	142 (0.020)
"Is your gender the same as your sex?"	6759 (0.985)	104 (0.015)
"Are you trans/have a trans history?"	6743 (0.982)	117 (0.017)

	Response	Nonresponse
"What is your gender?"	6897 (0.994)	45 (0.006)
"Is your gender the same as your sex?"	6823 (0.987)	87 (0.013)
"Are you trans/have a trans history?"	6812 (0.989)	79 (0.011)

Does the content/frequency of the free text responses change based on the question language and order?

Finding 5: “What is your current gender” significantly reduced the quantity of free-text responses. (~1 percentage point)

Finding 6: Including a non-binary option would reduce free-text responses.

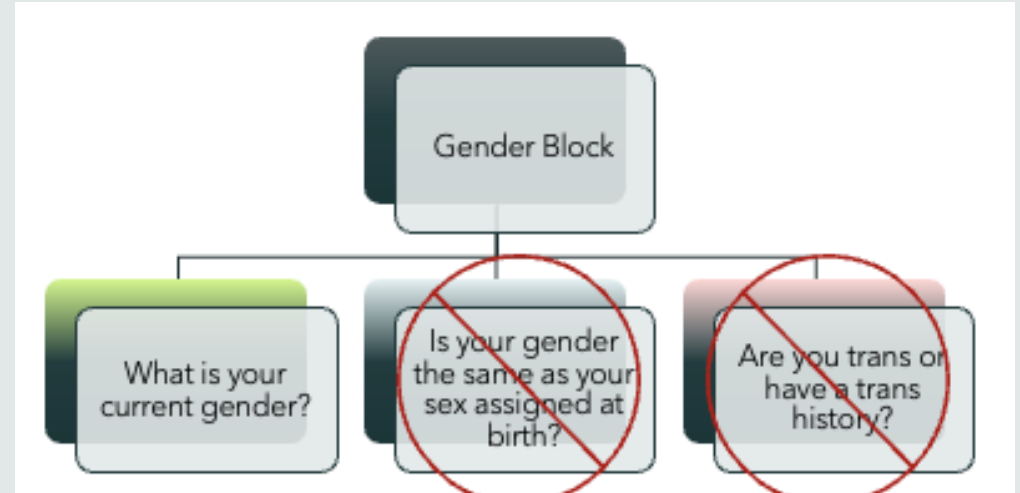
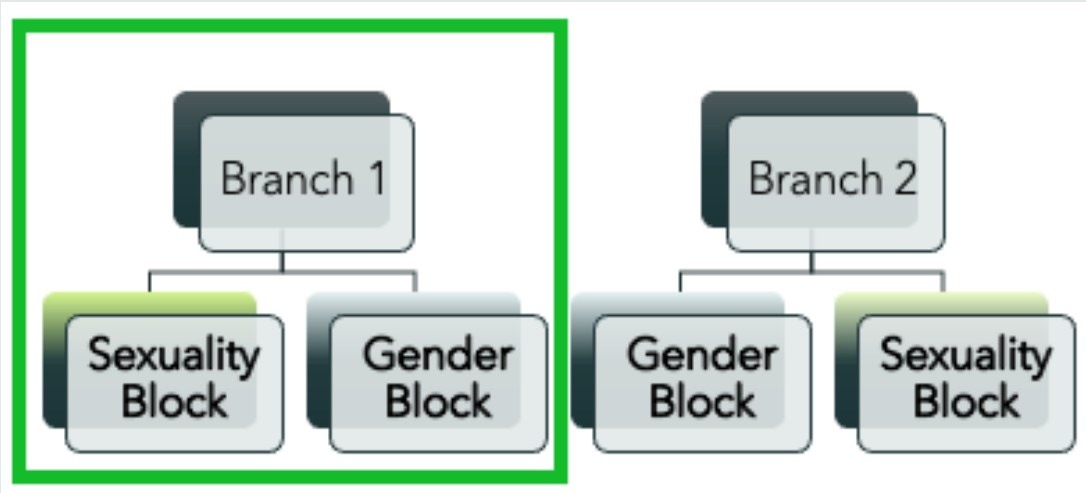

Q2.1

What sex were you assigned at birth? (For example, on your birth certificate.)

- Male
- Female
- Other
- Prefer not to say

Q2.2

What is your current gender?

- Woman
- Man
- Non-binary / third gender
- A gender not listed here

Q3.2

Is the gender you identify with the same as your sex registered at birth?

- Yes
- No (You may enter your gender identity below)

- Prefer not to say

Q4.2

Do you consider yourself to be trans, or have a trans history?

- No
- Yes, please describe your trans status (for example, non-binary, trans man, trans woman)

- Prefer not to say

Differences in Non-Straight Disclosure with Sexuality and Gender Block Randomization

Limited Sexuality Question	1.43	2500.9	0.15	0.80	0.02	-0.01	0.04
Expansive Sexuality Question	1.25	2513.4	0.21	1	0.02	-0.01	0.04

Differences in Non-Cisgender Disclosure with Sexuality and Gender Block Randomization

T-Statistic	Degrees of Freedom	P-Value	Bonferroni-Corrected P-Value	Mean Difference	Lower CI	Upper CI
2.63	2047.5	0.009	0.04	0.01	0.003	0.02

Two-Step Randomization (Pilot Study)

- With sample size, tested only: "what is your gender?" and "is your gender the same as your sex?"
- No significant differences in non-cis disclosure across the questions
- Asking about gender the same as sex significantly increased sex and gender nondisclosure

Tl;dr: We knew we needed larger N to test for differences in non-cisgender disclosure.
