Respondents who volunteer another identity (e.g., queer, same-gender-loving; pansexual) are recorded as "Other LGBT" by interviewers. These responses are included in the LGBT estimate.

Data were not collected in 2018 and 2019.

Measurement Debate

Pros	Cons
Great inclusivity of minority identities (representation)	Need to determine which identities are measured (still exclusive)
New data to understand emerging social realities	Data harmonization to understand longstanding inequalities
Better counts of minority populations	Potentially worse counts for majority populations
Detailed data	Privacy, undercounts

Does the block order affect disclosure and nonresponse patterns?



Data: Pilot Study

Finding 1: Sexuality before gender increased noncisgender disclosure. (~1 percentage point)

Finding 2: Ordering had no significant difference on nonresponse.

Disclosure by Block Randomization (Pilot Study)

Does the wording of the twostep gender question affect disclosure and nonresponse?



Finding 3: Asking for gender in relation to sex significantly *reduced* noncisgender disclosure. (~.5 percentage points)

Finding 4: Asking about gender in relation to sex and trans status significantly *increased* nonresponse. (~.2 percentage points)

Finding 5: "What is your current gender" significantly reduced the quantity of free-text responses. (~1 percentage point)

Finding 6: Including a non-binary option would reduce free-text responses.

Two-Step Randomization (Pilot Study)

- With sample size, tested only: "what is your gender?" and "is your gender the same as your sex?"
- No significant differences in non-cis disclosure across the questions
- Asking about gender the same as sex significantly increased sex and gender nondisclosure

Tl;dr: We knew we needed larger *N* to test for differences in non-cisgender disclosure.
